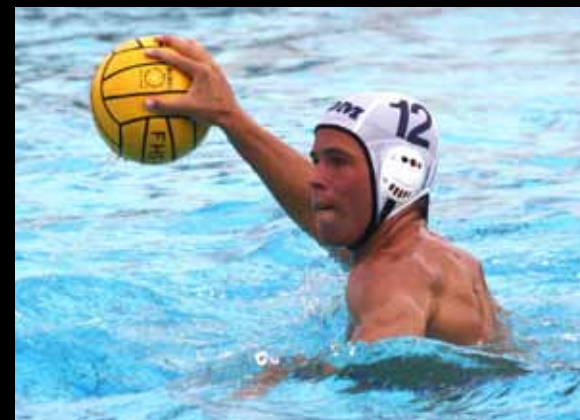

er Division II second-round match Thursday.

The defense will help the Sea Kings as they advance. Individually, O'Dea said he has multiple strong defenders. Last year this was the case, as Hayden Ramsey, Nick Treadaway and Evan Ramsey shined.

This year it's a virtually new team. New shutdown defenders have stepped in: senior Charlie Howarth and juniors Reid Chase, Colby Watson and Kyle Trush.
